

Mike Holm's sudden passing at 39 came with disbelief for all. A cornerstone with the Muskoka Hornets Baseball organization, Mike played ball himself with various groups. Below, a few excerpts from the Hornets reprinted here with permission.

...no project was too big or too small for Mike...board member, coach, equipment manager, house league coordinator, tournament convener and jack of every trade...100% dedicated to his family and Hornets baseball.

...he loved to pass on his baseball wisdom to his Peewee Select team and sons, Mark and Lucas.

...the (bantam) team took to the field with heavy hearts Sunday morning to do battle in the quarter finals with Thornhill. Prior to the game, the players shared a moment of silence on the pitching mound in tribute, having the night before decided the tournament must be won in Mike's name. With a loud cheer of 'For Mike', the team won 8-6...the team rode a wave of emotion, jumping out to a 5-run lead in the 1st and never looking back on route to a 15-8 championship victory. The team is honoured to dedicate this tournament win to Mike Holm, for everything he did for the organization, and for just being Mikey.

...overwhelming to see many black and gold jerseys at yesterday's visitations and today's funeral. Equally as impressive were other baseball organizations in attendance.

...prior to the Peewee Select game, the Hornets gathered for a moment of silence.

...Hornets President Peter Haynes presented Mark Holm with his new jersey #25, as Mark requested he change his number to the one worn by his dad... #25 will be retired save for Mark and potentially Lucas should he decide to switch his number...

A fundraising platform has been established at ca.gofundme.com/mikeholm to provide Vicky and the boys with emotional support and financial assistance.

Mike is survived by wife Vicky and sons Mark, 11 and Lucas, 8, both Muskoka Hornets players.

Curling In Bracebridge's First Indoor Skating Rink

The first year of curling competition in Bracebridge was in 1899 - using the centre ice of John Dunn's first rink on the west bank of the Muskoka River adjacent to the present day Timber Mart's storage buildings. This no doubt served their purpose temporarily, not so much for hockey though as the posts down the middle made a hockey game a little challenging.

There is no reference as to when the Bracebridge Curling Club's own building at the corner of Taylor Road and Front Street was completed, but it must have been ready shortly after 1900.

The multi-purpose hardwood floor, that served as the base for the ice surface referred to previously, may also have formed the base for the natural ice of John Dunn's first rink and the Yearley rink, (built in 1932 on the same lot as present day Memorial Community Centre), because there is often mention of all those rinks being used



for various functions in the off-season, including roller skating, dances, celebrations and the like.

For whatever reason, in 1905, the club decided to form a separate company to manage the building. Perhaps the general membership found out quickly that curling was fun, but it came with a lot of work maintaining the building that they created. The management company, no doubt more of a sub-committee of the executive than a "company", consisted of the following individuals - F.P. Warne, G.W. Ecclestone, W.A. Gillespie, William Kingsmill, Harry Bridgland, H.J. Bird Jr., and John Thomson, prominent Bracebridge names whose legacy remains with us to this day.

MUSKOKA CUP SETS RECORD

Muskoka Hornets Baseball hosts its 9th Annual 'Muskoka Cup' tournament series throughout the region. 50 teams compete across four divisions over two weekends. This number of teams sets a record for attendance, reflecting the popularity of this event.

It started June 30 with a 12-team Peewee event in Huntsville, won by Orangeville.

From July 21 - 23, the other 3 divisions do battle. 16 Mosquito teams compete in Bracebridge at Peake Field, while Huntsville's McCulley Robertson diamonds have 16 Bantam and, for the first time, 6 rookie teams, competing for Muskoka Cup bragging rights.

The economic impact of these tournaments is significant for Muskoka. According to Hornets' President Peter Haynes, as many as 750 families will spend time here. "The traffic that results from tournament visitors is a huge boost to the region," commented Haynes. "Despite the busy period, teams manage to find places to stay, and often extend visits beyond the weekend," he added.

Completing the weekend event, on top of all the great group and solo performances, Muskoka Dance Connection, as a studio, finished 4th overall of 19 studios.

The dance year wrapped up with 5 studio recital shows over 2 weekends at the Rene M. Caisse Theatre.

6 MUSAC athletes qualified to attend this meet for swimmers under 14 and, by the end, 5 medals came home!

12 yr-old Owen Jibb broke club records in the 100m & 200m breaststroke, resulting in gold and bronze respectively.

Speed racer, Daniel Ortiz, swam like a silver bullet which, appropriately enough, earned him 2nd in the 14 yr-old boys 200m freestyle!

Fantastic performances came from distance swimmers, Ethan Thomas, Ian Markham, and Branwyn Shaw in the 800m freestyle. All followed perfect race strategy and even-split their races, resulting in personal bests and bronze medals for Ian and Branwyn. Ian achieved a provincial standard time as well.

Ben Guerriero, 11, the youngest of the Festival team, came away with personal best times in FIVE of his races, moving up the rankings in each event!

The team missed Catrice Black who qualified but, unfortunately, suffered an injury prior to the meet forcing her withdrawal.

The Muskoka Limberettes' two provincial trampoline athletes were in Barrie to compete at the Trampoline and Tumbling Ontario Championships.



HAWKS "DYNAMIC DUO" MAKE TEAM ONTARIO

ongratulations to Bracebridge boys and Huntsville Peewee Hawks', Kean Pare and Carson Robins, on being selected to Team Ontario. A dream come true realized through hours of hard work, physically and mentally, over the past year.

Team Ontario lacrosse is a high performance program, for Peewee, Bantam and Midget levels, for the Ontario Lacrosse Association (OLA) that compete in the Canadian Lacrosse Association National Tournaments. This year for the Peewees, the tournament will be held in Whitby, August 6-12. Team Ontario will compete against B.C., Alberta, Saskatchewan, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Team Iroquois. Kean and Carson are presently preparing for the Nationals with their team in hopes of bringing home the National Championship Title. It is an exceptional year to participate in the National Championships as it's the 150th Anniversary of Lacrosse in Canada.

In order to play for Team Ontario, an intensive 3-session process is undertaken in April and May. All OLA eligible athletes are invited to sign up for the first tryout. After this, the approximately 65 players who made it to the next round, received a phone call from Peewee Head Coach Troy Cordingley (Head Coach, Buffalo Bandits NLL Team), inviting them to the 2nd tryout early May. In mid-May, the final 31 players and goalies attended the final tryout in Pickering. It was an intense and physically challenging day of warm-ups, drills, and scrimmages to evaluate which 18 players and 2 goalies would make the team. After the tryout, both

Kean and Carson, were told that their hard work, perseverance, and "love of the game" paid off. They both made Team Ontario. Though Kean and Carson both currently play for the Hawks, the boys journey as friends and teammates did not start there.

Carson, 12, a Bracebridge native, started his box, then field, lacrosse career as a 2nd year Tyke in 2013 with the Hawks Association. Wanting to play lacrosse more frequently, he joined an off-season lacrosse program offered through Jr. C Lax in the winter of 2014. His team was the Niagara Lock Monsters. It was there he met Kean.

Kean, from Kitchener now living in Bracebridge, started playing box lacrosse as a Tyke minor in 2012 for the Kitchener Braves. Kean and Carson became fast friends when playing for the Lock Monsters. Often referred to as the "Dynamic Duo", they led their team to an undefeated season, winning the Gold Championship.

By the fall, both were recruited to play for Evolve Elite, a U.S. field lacrosse travel program. Evolve took the boys to tournaments throughout the U.S. They were excited to be playing together again and started referring to each other as "Lax Bros". While it was hard for Kean and Carson to play against each other, the boys started to express their desire to play together again.

That wish came true this year when Kean's family transferred to Muskoka for work, and Kean became a Huntsville Hawk! Both families are extremely proud of the boys. They both exude the values they've learned through lacrosse on and off the floor.

Muskoka and the Huntsville Hawks Lacrosse Association will be cheering Kean and Carson on to a National Championship.



League play's at Peake Fields Tuesday, Thursday & Friday start 7pm... great ball as the season winds down.




No Snow Skiing
