







# International Stars Curled In Muskoka

The largest and most successful curling events in all of Muskoka were the Muskoka International Mixed Bonspiels involving Bracebridge, Gravenhurst and Huntsville.

It started in 1958 with a remarkable 88 rinks in the very first competition and continued until 1991. During that era, the two draw masters with the longest tenure, George Powell of Gravenhurst and Brian Howden of Bracebridge, had the very difficult and frustrating task of organizing a game schedule for a large number of teams in three different venues. Over its lifetime the average number of rinks competing was in excess of 100.

In 1959, New Zealand's ambassador to Canada, Sir Leslie Munroe, officially opened the games and welcomed over 100 rinks to the event.

Many well-known Muskoka and internationally recognized competitors' names, along with those of their wives, appear on the cup as champions.

Those who won with their wives as teammates include Paul Savage in 1983, Russ Howard (Canadian and World Champion

in 1981) representing Gravenhurst, and in 1989 with his brother Glenn representing Huntsville.

Bracebridge teams won the competition five times, Gravenhurst four, Huntsville three and Port Carling once. Skips for the five



winning Bracebridge teams were, Jack Atkinson (1964), George Parlett (1971), John Saunders (1973), Gary Martin (1974) and Brian Howden (1979).

Dances, banquets and billeting the competitors were all part of the fun. Local retail, restaurant and service businesses flourished in each of the involved areas.

## SPECIAL OLYMPICS SEEKS ATHLETES & COACHES

uskoka's Special Olympics programs have provided opportunities in sport for athletes with an intellectual disability for over 20 years. Coached by local volunteers, athletes have represented this community at the district, provincial and national levels.

The local council maintains eight sport clubs offering weekly training throughout the season.

During winter, athletes may be outdoors on the Nordic ski trails (Sundays@1pm, Arrowhead Provincial Park, Huntsville), swimming laps at the pool (Fridays @ 3:30 pm, Bracebridge Sportsplex), curling at the rink (Thursdays @ 3:30-5 pm, Gravenhurst Curling Club), or playing floor hockey (Tuesdays @ 6:30 pm, Beachgrove Public School, Gravenhurst). One of the more popular activities is 5-pin bowling (Wednesday @ 3:30-4:30 pm, Quality Inn, Bracebridge).

In summer, athletes can choose from softball, t-ball or golf. There is potential for other sports to be offered, including basketball and bocce.

Special Olympics Ontario offers several school events in Muskoka, attracting secondary students from Muskoka and beyond. The Bracebridge Muskoka Lakes Secondary School Basketball team received the Special Olympics Ontario School Team of the Year Award in 2016.

Athlete and volunteer recruitment are important for local programs to develop. Lynn Self, Community Coordinator for SOO-Muskoka, looks forward to welcoming new members to the movement. "Volunteering with this organization is very rewarding," says Self. "Our athletes have tremendous abilities and it's wonderful to see them shine."

Currently, the community's floor hockey program requires new coaches. The 2017/18 season is important, as there's a tournament in April that will see teams selected to the Provincial Championships in 2019. While coaches with a background in sport are important for team development, those looking to volunteer in general are encouraged to become involved.

# PIONEERS PREPPED FOR STRETCH RUN

The Coldwater Ice Wolves, quickly becoming the main rival, rolled into Bracebridge last month on an 8-game winning streak. The Pioneers stepped up, held them to a tie and won in a shootout. Coldwater sits just ahead of Bracebridge.

At the halfway point of their inaugural season (at press), the Bracebridge Pioneers continue to impress.

They still sit in 3rd place in the Canadian Premier Junior Hockey League's (CPJHL) West division, and 4th overall in the league with a record of 13-4-0.

During the past month there has been a little more focus on the defensive side of the game. They've brought their goals against average down to 2.94, behind only league front-runners Essa and Smith's Falls.

Offensively, the Pioneers are led by Kristian Luptak. Then 5 local-area boys round out the top 9 in scoring.

Captain Doug Ledger (20G-21A), Carson Jacklin (7G-22A), Nathan Lyndon (9G-9A), Oliver Hammond (8G-9A) and Aaron Shaw (4G-7A) are each averaging more than a point a game. Ledger's average is 2.56 points per game while Lyndon leads all defensemen.

Following the Christmas break, the Pioneers enter the stretch drive with their first 4 games at home. And, there's going to be some tough ones in there.

The Grey Highlands Hawks come in January 6, game time 7pm. Then the Pioneers host league leading Essa Stallions on the 20th at 7pm, followed by the high octane offense of the Maniwaki Mustangs who come to town on the 27th (note start time of 6:30pm) and lastly the Seaforth Generals on February 3, 7pm start.

All games are at the Bracebridge Arena.



ello my name is Judo Jeff Allen. I'd like to tell you a little bit about how I got started in judo.

We enjoyed the quick read, hope you do too)

It started with a simple discussion with my son Lucas and my wife Crystal. We all decided that it would be something great for Lucas and I to join something together. To create a pastime, have a hobby we could do together.

We chose the sport of judo and loved it right off the bat. We would go to training, not only at the Huntsville Judo Club but eventually all over Ontario.

After three months we started competing and we both did very well.

Just a yearand-a-half later I got my first invitation to fight at the National Judo Championships in Richmond BC. I fought well there, but wasn't able to come home with a medal. It was enough though to keep going.



I continued training and fighting hard and in 2015, I fought again in the Nationals in Quebec. This time I received a gold.

I became the heavyweight Judo champ of Canada.

After that came New York City, Quebec and then on to Calgary for the National Judo championships again. I fought hard there and brought home a silver.

I was then selected to go and compete at the World Judo championships in Fort Lauderdale, Florida in 2016. I fought competitors from all over the world. In the bronze medal fight I was up against a competitor from Spain who weighed over 400 pounds. I fought hard.

With my son Lucas and my wife Crystal on the sidelines cheering me on, I was able to finish the fight and bring home a bronze medal to Canada.

I love the respect in Judo, the hard competition and the one-onone fights. But, most of all, I love to train with my son, Lucas Allen. He inspires me to do well and to show him that with hard work and determination...you can achieve your goals.

That's what's most important.

There are cross-country ski programs for all ages, including Jackrabbit and Track Attack programs, recreational cross-country ski lessons and games for kids ages 4 to 13.


The ARC Racing Program hosts bi-weekly practices, training camps and races for ages 11 and up. Winter session begins in January.

he South Muskoka Curling and Golf Club recently played host to the annual Canadian Tire Hunters Bonspiel.


